Question 12

Contestants on the recent *Alone Australia* survival reality TV show were dropped deep into the Tasmanian west-coast wilderness in the middle of winter. Their goal was to live on their own and gather flora and fauna to eat, and outlast each other. However, what each of the contestants could take, kill and eat was governed by Tasmanian environmental laws and First Nations cultural codes. First Nations practitioners were consulted by *Alone Australia* producers to identify what was appropriate for contestants to hunt and forage in western lutruwita (Tasmania). Contestants were educated on aspects of Indigenous practices.

Indigenous people have walked and cared for this land since before recorded time, continuing their role as traditional custodians to educate others and continue to care and protect their beliefs, knowledge and culture.

Discuss how indigenous people's sense of place is founded on their unique relationships with the land.

Question 13

The Three Capes Track Walk, a 4-day / 3-night 48 kilometre walk starting at Port Arthur in the south of the state, experienced its greatest volume of bookings since Tasmania's borders re-opened following the COVID-19 pandemic. Other experiences, and eco-tourism generally in Tasmania, have seen similar growth.

Discuss how leaders can use Peter Martin's 'Signposts to Nature' as a way to increase and facilitate participants' relationships and connection with the natural environment.
